Create New and Leverage Existing Spaces for Student Learning, Living, and Leadership Experiences



- Leased and are effectively utilizing Springhill Suites Hotel as a residential living & learning space to help accommodate a larger than projected entering class
- Refurbishment planning for Collins Hall is underway with a FY 23 construction timeline
- Planning will begin soon for refurbishment of Memorial and Alexander Halls (HRC) with a FY 24 construction timeline
- Additional office space for Multicultural Affairs Coalitions was completed and became operational this fall
- Funds have been raised to begin phase I renovations to the Bear Habitat
