Dear Division Colleagues,

The semester is in full swing now and campus is again full and buzzing with energy. If you want a quick snapshot of what a student body of 20,000+ looks like, go for a stroll in the transition time between classes.

IMPACT Lots has happened in the last two weeks! Starting with Welcome Week,

leading up to the start of classes. Incoming students were placed in small groups based on where they lived, each group with 1-2 Welcome Week Leaders. For a recap of WW events click **HERE**. After classes started NSP continued to welcome our new students with **over 200 students** attending the Out of State Mixer, and approximately 60 new transfer students joined the Transfer Mixer co-hosted with CASE. Also occurring during welcome week was the highly successful **Celebration** of Community & Faith (Church Fair) which featured 61 local

churches, and despite the heat, saw a packed-out Vera Daniel Plaza for 2 full hours. The semester started off strong with Mosaic Week, headlined by the Mosaic Mixer. Over 750 people showed up and a record 60 student

organizations signed up to table during the event. The event also featured The Mosaic Showcase, and this year the first Mosaic Bear Trophy was awarded to the winners of the Showcase, Alpha Kappa Alpha Inc. The

Black Student Welcome, LatinX Night, and Mosaic Asian Night, were also well attended with an estimated 750 attendees total across the three nights. At the end of the first week was the much-anticipated <u>Late Night</u>. The night started at the SLC featuring a dodgeball tournament, demos from our 30+ sport clubs, and activities, food, and prizes. New this year, the second part of the night was at McLane Stadium, featuring opportunities for students to get to know our 395 student

organizations, food trucks, and a 360-video booth. BUPD reported that

attendance for the evening saw **roughly 5,000 people participate**.

Another notable event from the last two weeks was the return of Dr Pepper Hour. Roughly 1,100 attendees came to each of the first two Dr Pepper Hours this semester. Finally, last but certainly not least, this past weekend we officially welcomed the newest Baylor Bears, Belle and Indy to campus. We hosted a Meet

the CUBS party at the habitat on Saturday, and so many people showed up that we gave out all 500 t-shirts in less than an **hour.** The event was scheduled for two hours, but there was so much excitement that guests continued to show up and engage well past 1pm.


